
# Safe Harbor Shelter

## IMMEDIATE SAFETY. **BASIC NECESSITIES.**

At Safe Harbor, youth ages 10-17 who are in the midst of a crisis find immediate safety, counseling and basic necessities. During their temporary stay with CHS, we also work with their families to access support, therapy and other local resources that can help them address the crises they've experienced.

Open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, Safe Harbor is a temporary residential facility offering safety, shelter, food and structured activities in a warm, home-like atmosphere.

### DURING A STAY AT THE SHELTER, **YOUTH:**

- 🛨 engage in daily activities designed to build life skills,
- ★ attend school, and
- ★ work to address crises with the goal of family reunification.



#### COUNSELING & SUPPORT FOR KIDS, TEENS & FAMILIES.

Families raising children ages 6-17 who are defiant, truant and/or struggle with behavioral challenges receive tools and practical support, as well as connections to additional resources – including counseling – that can empower them to work through difficult situations. With an underlying goal to prevent entry or re-entry into the juvenile justice system, CHS professionals also coach families through tough topics as an additional layer of support.

FREE services for youth ages 6-17 – and their families – to help improve their behaviors, resolve conflicts effectively and start communicating effectively.
